Taunakitia Te Marae Project

Taunakitia Te Marae is a project to understand what is important to marae, what a well functioning marae looks like, what the status of the TPT marae are and what collective solutions can be developed. All TPT marae are invited to participate in this project.

Key learnings from the project so far have highlighted that:

- little information has been published on marae well being;
- marae want more engagement with whanau and rangatahi,
- paying bills especially rates and insurance can be a challenge,
- marae are limited users of technology such as phone, computers and internet,
- governance training and management planning is needed.

The results of this project will help Te Arawa Tangata understand how it can assist marae with collective solutions.

The next step in the project is a survey. Surveys will take approximately one hour to complete and can be done a number of ways including online.

The survey will need to be completed by people with a good overview and understanding of your marae by 30 June 2013.

Aneta Morgan will be in contact with your Chairperson to organise for your marae to participate in this survey.

Survey will run from 17 June to 28 June 2013

Marae Insurance Wananga

Te Arawa Tangata has found that a common issue for all marae is the rising cost of insurance. To help marae consider solutions that will reduce the cost of insurance Te Arawa Tangata is facilitating a wananga on Tuesday 2 July. The wananga is a chance for marae to learn more about insurance, consider potential insurance options and decide if they wish to participate in a collective Te Arawa insurance programme.

The wananga which will include a presentation, workshop, light dinner, networking and panel discussion.
